

E safety curriculum 2017/18

Resources and Scheme of Work

- All teaching and non-teaching staff should be aware of and be able to recognise e-safety issues when they arise
- Teaching E-safety skills is a priority (and taught explicitly in computing and PSHE lessons)
- Clear reporting processes exist when safety issues are highlighted
- There is a progressive e-safety curriculum in place

In our schools we have an e-safety policy available for reference on the network. A copy is on the safeguarding noticeboard in the staffroom.

At the start of every half term, the first computing lesson should stress the SMART safety rules and every classroom needs to have a copy of the laminated poster on display.

There should be **frequent** reminders and input into the class lessons throughout the year about the aspects of online use that we want our pupils to be aware of and safe from abuse, with timetabled lessons and events in each term.

<p>Safe Searching: Pupils learn they can go to exciting places online, but they need to follow certain rules to remain safe. Directory sites with ABC searching can be useful.</p> <p>Sharing Personal Information: Pupils learn that websites often ask for personal details and learn how to handle requests sensibly</p> <p>Communication: Pupils learn that messaging and emails can be used to communicate with real people within their schools, families and communities.</p>	<p>Websites: Pupils learn that they can stay safe online by choosing websites that are good for them and avoiding sites that are inappropriate.</p> <p>Digital Trails: Pupils learn that the information they put online leaves a digital footprint.</p> <p>Communication: Pupils learn that sometimes people can act like bullies online and this is called 'cyberbullying.'</p>	<p>Communication: Pupils learn that online and in-person messages are different.</p> <p>Pupils learn that people can connect online and communicate through communities and websites.</p> <p>Online security: Pupils learn the benefits of using passwords and the strategies that can be used to create strong, safe passwords.</p>	<p>Communication: Pupils learn about how they can respond to messages received online that make them feel angry, hurt, sad or fearful.</p> <p>Pupils learn what it means to be responsible and respectful in their online messaging.</p> <p>Online security: Pupils learn strategies to improve accuracy when searching online</p> <p>Pupils learn to think critically about the private information they share online.</p>	<p>Online security: Pupils learn how to create strong passwords to protect themselves online from identity theft.</p> <p>Pupils learn what spam is and how to deal with it.</p> <p>Communication: Pupils learn not to reveal private information to people online.</p>	<p>Communication: Pupils learn about cyberbullying, how it has similarities to in-person bullying and strategies to deal with it when it happens.</p> <p>Online security: Pupils learn how secure websites keep their private information safe, by checking privacy policies and settings.</p>
