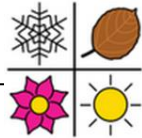


YEAR 1 Knowledge Organiser 1

I need to notice that it is getting dark earlier



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I need to understand and use these words:

sun, rain, drizzle, hail, sleet, snow, frost, fog, mist, wind, thunder, lightning

Challenge:

Learn your birth date and find out which season it is in.



Why do we have seasons?

The earth moves around the sun. The earth is tilted (wonky) and so is sometimes near the sun (summer) and sometimes further away (winter)
